#### **SkillsBuilder & Careers**



This term, the ALP was re-awarded Skills Builder Flagship Status for our work with Essential Skills. This award makes the ALP one of only fourteen organisations to hold Flagship Status internationally.



For our work with careers, in November, our schools were assessed and awarded the Career Mark. The Career Mark is awarded excellence for in careers, employability and enterprise provision. The Career Mark assessment of our schools reported:

'These schools are an exceptional example of the delivery of careers related learning. Their structures, curriculum framework and delivery practices are amongst the very best and pupil response is exceptional. As a result, pupils are given the best possible preparation to make a successful transition to secondary education and to a successful and fulfilling working life'.

The ALP also achieved the Primary Gatsby Benchmarks. The Primary Gatsby Benchmarks are defined as a framework for world-class careers provision. Well done to everyone involved.

## **Inclusion Conference**



Well done to pupils from Bothal Primary who were selected to attend the first 'Student Inclusion Panel' at Northumberland County Council. In advance of the first meeting, pupils worked hard to prepare a

presentation sharing their views on what makes an

inclusive education system. On Wednesday 13 December, the children presented their views to members of the Local Authority. Mike Finley, Head of SEND commented, "The messages were incredibly powerful and clearly demonstrated the Local Authorities need to follow their direction and empower their voices and words. It is clear how important our collective role is to facilitate this."

In the coming weeks, the children will attend further meetings and have tasks to complete to support the development of local Authority SEND provision.

During the Autumn term, the Ashington Learning Partnership was delighted to renew its status as a Trust of Sanctuary. This award has been held for three years and recognises the Trust's outstanding
