

Times Tables Rock Stars Day – Friday 5th December 🎸

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are excited to let you know that on Friday 5th December, we will be holding a Times Tables Rock Stars Day across Key Stage 2 to celebrate and promote the importance of learning times tables.

To help us get into the spirit of the day, children are invited to come to school dressed as a Rock Star! This can be as bold or as simple as you wish—there is absolutely no expectation to buy anything new.

A fun and easy option is our “**Best Black Bag Rock Star Outfit**”, and we now have two low-cost ideas you can choose from. These are simply suggestions to inspire you—children are welcome to wear any rock star-themed outfit they choose.

#### **Black Bag Outfit Idea 1 – Classic Rock Waistcoat**

- Cut a bin bag into a waistcoat-style top and pair it with jeans or leggings
- Add a homemade cardboard guitar
- Finish with sunglasses, spiky hair or foil stars for decoration

#### **Black Bag Outfit Idea 2 – Rock Star Bin Bag Dress**

- Use a bin bag as a simple dress by cutting armholes and a neckline
- Add a belt made from foil, ribbon or rolled-up paper
- Decorate with paper stars, lightning bolts or stickers
- Wear over leggings or shorts for comfort and ease



Other cost-effective costume ideas include using items you may already have at home, such as:

- A denim jacket or old shirt decorated with foil stars or stickers
- Temporary hair colour spray or a quirky hairstyle (long hair must be tied up)
- A scarf, bandana or sunglasses
- Crafting simple accessories like wristbands or badges from cardboard

For safety reasons, please ensure children do not wear false nails or earrings and that they come in sensible footwear.

Throughout the day, children will take part in a range of fun, multiplication-themed activities designed to build confidence, enthusiasm and engagement with Times Tables Rock Stars both in and out of school.

Finally, please keep an eye out for additional information coming soon, including updates on TTRS homework expectations, guidance for supporting children at home, details about the Year 4 Multiplication Check, and how to understand and adjust your child’s TTRS game settings if needed.
