Medication:

All medication is to be handed in to staff, before getting onto coaches and the relevant forms filled in. Asthmatics should have two inhalers... One with them and one with a helper. If your child needs a travel sickness tablet to travel, please provide this in its original packaging, named and fill out the medical form.



What to pack:

We strongly advise that best clothes are not brought to camp. It is primarily an outdoor holiday where clothes are likely to get dirty. Items of clothing are also sometimes lost because they have no names marked on them.

The following list is not designed to be exclusive:

- Toiletries: soap, shampoo, **towel**, toothpaste, toothbrush etc
- A separate towel, water bottle and bag for use at the beach.**
- At least two pairs of bottoms (Tracksuit/Leggings /Jogging Pants) including footwear.
- At least two t-shirts and two tops (hoodies or jumpers).
- changes of underwear.
- Wet weather clothing: waterproof coat, shoes or wellingtons.**
- Old shoes to go rock pooling in- these are essential for rock pooling and entering the sea as children cannot go bare foot**
- Trainers, t-shirts, shorts.
- Swimwear.
- Suitable footwear for wearing around camp (which can be kept dry).
- Sunhat and sun cream.
- Teddy bear/ book/ small game/ colouring book

No bedding or sleeping bags are required,

No Mobile phones (smart watches and similar) or electronic devices to brought. No snacks, sweets or nut products- there are allergies on Camp

There will be updates from school. However, we are busy pretty much all of the time and may take time to get back to you.
